PROGRAMS COMMITTEE: The January meeting speaker is Colonel Charles Tutt, USMCR (Ret). Charlie served two tours in Vietnam, first as an infantry platoon leader and the second time, flew F-4 Phantoms. His last active-duty tour was at NAS Brunswick Flying the T-39 and A-4. He continued Marine flying with time in the F-8 Crusader, F-4, and OV-10 Bronco in the Marine Corps Reserve. His billets included VMO-4 Squadron Commanding Officer, 4th Marine Air Wing G-2, G-3, and

Wing Chief of Staff. As a civilian he flew for Delta Air Lines on the Convair 880, DC-8, Boeing 727, L 1011, DC-9, Boeing 757 and 767. He also served Delta as System Manager Flight Operations, Director Flight Operations, and Chief Pilot. After retiring he assisted with the company's restructuring and later became Vice President of Flight Operations for Delta subsidiaries ASA/ExpressJet.

In his ASA/ExpressJet assignments Col. Tutt was tasked with assisting in the startup of a Socialist Republic of Vietnam airline where he encountered a senior North Vietnamese general who recruited Charlie to organize a symposium of US (Navy, Marine, Air Force) pilots and North Vietnamese pilots. He will share with us the very moving and fascinating story of how the three meetings – in Hanoi, San Diego, and Ho Chi Minh City (Saigon) came to fruition.



SURVIVING SPOUSE LIAISON:

- Starting this month, VA's Office of Survivors Assistance will be moved from the Veterans Benefits Administration to the Office of the VA Secretary, reversing a Biden-era decision that buried OSA under layers of bureaucracy.
- Starting this month, VA will create a "white glove" survivor outreach team to guide and assist eligible survivors throughout their Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC) claims process.
- Starting immediately, VA will begin work to identify areas where automation can be used to make the DIC claims process easier to navigate for survivors.

Military Pay Outlook: Why Smaller Increases Are Likely in Coming Years by: Kevin Lilley, December 23, 2025

Servicemembers will receive a 3.8% pay raise in 2026, but their 2027 figure could be lower based on a recent benchmark. Servicemembers are in line for a 3.8% pay hike as part of the <u>annual must-pass defense policy bill</u>, but a figure released this month by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) points to a smaller boost in 2027. The Employment Cost Index (ECI) for wages and salaries of private-industry workers rose 3.6% for the 12 months ending in September 2025, <u>according to BLS data</u>. That figure will be used to inform the military basic pay rise for 2027. It would be the smallest raise since a 2.7% boost in 2022 and would continue a downward trend from the 5.2% hike in 2024. The 4.5% base pay raise in 2025 was accompanied by a MOAA-supported 10% target increase <u>for junior enlisted members</u>.

Keeping Up With Costs

The percentages for the ECI and the pay raise have been the same for about a decade. Despite this trend (and associated statute), either Congress or the President can propose a pay raise that does not mirror the ECI figure; military pay fell below the ECI number for three years (2014-16), trailing ECI in 2016 by a full percentage point (2.3% ECI benchmark, 1.3% raise).

Ensuring service-earned compensation retains its value continues to be a driving force for MOAA's advocacy efforts. Pay is no exception: MOAA supports a raise at or above the ECI figure, with anything less posing a risk to overall readiness. Even as recruiting issues subside, a force that does not offer competitive compensation will lose key talent to the civilian sector. Why above ECI? Raising military pay would help offset the "pay gap" created during the three years the raise lagged ECI benchmarks.

Supporting Those Who Serve

A fair pay increase is just one goal for MOAA's ongoing work on behalf of those in uniform. Other top priorities include:

- The <u>restoration of Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH)</u> to cover 100% of housing costs, a welcome benefit to the
 bottom line of the majority of servicemembers who live off base. After cuts to the benefit in the 2010s, these military
 families are expected to pay 5% of these costs out of pocket. Many end up paying a higher percentage, especially in
 competitive rental markets.
- Improved access to care in the military health system (MHS), to include preserving medical staffing levels and creating a digital platform to report access issues and help servicemembers and their families navigate the system.
- **Spouse and family priorities**, such as continued work to support <u>military spouse employment</u> and to improve child care assistance and availability.
